Tour & Taxis was originally Europe's first multimodal freight station, depot and customs hub. While the immense and stunning

industrial buildings, built from 1902 to 1907, have outlived their original purpose, a major redevelopment project

has given them a second life as a cultural hotspot in Brussels. During the guided tour we will explore the industrial heritage of this iconic site in the capital.

Schaerbeek station is situated in the middle of the Belgian railway network. Based in the heart of Europe, it lies on the route of Belgium's very first railway track, between Brussels and Mechelen. It is a true gem in Belgian railway architecture. The railway garden connects it with a new industrial hangar. Together with this new museum complex in the form of a sawtooth shape, the Schaerbeek
